MINUTES of the last meeting: The minutes from 2021 AGM were read and accepted. The matters arising were:

- 1. Lack of payment of subs by the HH members, IRW undertook to collect at the upcoming events. Covered under finance.
- 2. All other matters covered by agenda.

FINANCE: Financial position remains healthy apart from one proviso, covered later. Subscriptions are up from 16 to 20, donations similar to previous year. HH costs lower than normal as fee from 2020 (paid in Dec 2019) carried forward to 2021 following cancellation of the HH in 2020. Only top-up payment of £215 was charged for the 2021 entry fee. Proviso to the accounts is that included in the total assets is two years' worth of OTA subsidy towards the HH cost (£590 x 2). TD commented that he had received a letter/email from Jack Clark stating that the OTGS school fund stood at £11,500 and would we consider putting £5,000 towards a housing for a golf simulator. Most of the email recipients agreed this was good use of the funds and what the fund is intended for. RW referred back to IRW's action point re chasing subs non-payment and commented that this year we've been asking HH scratch players to contribute 50% of the cost for entering scratch competitions, which has been accepted and paid. So, 50% of the entry fees for HH, BNB and GM have been covered by the players and as RN commented this goes some way to contributing to the OTGS for those who do not pay OTGS subs.

Plans are in place for a golf simulator to be built at school this coming year, subject to planning permission and other necessary details going through.

TD suggested putting Astro-turf on uppers to hit golf balls and this is being considered. Further discussions took place re the source of funding for the simulator and the benefits this would bring to school golf.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS: Richard Jowett standing down, Richard Willacy elected Hon. Sec. Pete Whalley elected Captain, Terry Davidge remains as President. Richard Norris remains as Treasurer.

Swinley restricted numbers – DM noted that numbers have over the years increased, 46 this year, which has caused a problem with a few Swinley members as the 1st tee becomes unavailable for members until 11am (with both 1st and 10th tee being used to start from), so Swinley have told us that we must restrict numbers to 36.
